


The Island of Eternal Spring

Windjammer cruise around Tenerife

Sat 09 November 2019 ⇒ Sun 17 November 2019

Escape the wet and cold autumn weather and enjoy the mild maritime climate and a fresh ocean breeze on the Canary Islands! Around 25 degrees south of Germany, we will set sail for an eight-day discovery voyage around Tenerife, the 'Island of Eternal Spring', and its neighbouring islands in the Canary archipelago.





This is where you will go on board: Santa Cruz de Tenerife

This sailing trip starts in the capital of the Canary Island of Tenerife. The island's two landing sites can be easily reached from many international airports within a non-stop flight or with a stopover in Madrid. A taxi ride between the airport and the pier takes around 15 minutes. We will be happy to assist you with the individual planning of your arrival and departure. The largest of the Canary Islands is often referred to as the 'Island of Eternal Spring' due to its incomparable climate. Its secret lies in the mixture of scenic and cultural diversity. The natural scenery and landscape are characterised by the impressive contrasts between young volcanic areas, mountain landscapes, old laurel forests and bizarre rock gorges. Above all else towers Pico del Teide, Spain's highest mountain – the island's landmark will remain in sight for quite a while after we have set sail for one of the neighbouring islands.

After an introduction to sailing by the ship's crew, you can soon join in the sailing if you want to — no previous knowledge is needed. No two days are alike — even encounters with whales and dolphins are not unlikely in this part of the Atlantic! Blue-water sailing on the vast ocean is thirsty work and known to make sailors hungry — and hardworking sailors need refreshment! So you can look forward to the excellent onboard cuisine, which regularly receives top marks in our customer satisfaction surveys. The compass needle will point to relaxation soon after we've sailed the first nautical miles.

Our sailing waters: 'The Blessed Islands'

From the sea, we'll discover the neighbouring islands of Tenerife in the Canary Archipelago, which, in the literal translation are called the 'Blessed Islands'. It's time to experience the ship as a place of tranquillity, where you can leave the flood of information and the hectic buzz of everyday life behind you. Rest and relaxation are guaranteed, stops for going on shore and having a swim offer an exciting change from life on board the ship.

The route of our cruise depends on the wind, the weather and your wishes

The decision on where to head and, in particular, on the choice of port or mooring for the night is made by the captain on that same day – your wishes will be taken into account whenever possible.

This ensures that your cruise is a pleasant mix of adventure, relaxation, active participation and pure enjoyment. Possible stops in the port or at a mooring spot are:

• La Gomera – a paradise for hikers

The second-smallest of the seven main Canary Islands is of volcanic origin. It is considered a paradise for hikers and explorers with its numerous hills, valleys, an evergreen fern and cloud forest, as well as the largest laurel forest on earth. The island's ecosystem is a World Heritage Site protected by UNESCO. La Gomera was the last stop for Christopher Columbus before he left for the New World in 1492.



• La Palma – the beautiful, green island

Due to its natural beauty and lush vegetation, the most northwestern of the Canary Islands has two nicknames: 'Isla Bonita' (the beautiful island) and 'Isla Verde' (the green island). La Palma is still far away from mass tourism — hikers will find peace and a well-developed network of trails here. Sports enthusiasts can explore the island on a guided tour on horseback or by mountain bike.

The end of our journey brings us back to the port of Santa Cruz on Tenerife (pictured below). Here, you will leave the crew and 'your' ship with a sailor's bag full of unforgettable memories of your journey.



The Eye of the Wind in Santa Cruz

The area around Tenerife's capital has a wide variety of rich cultural facets. Make the most of your stay by taking a stroll along the magnificent streets ('Ramblas') of the pulsating capital Santa Cruz and make a detour to the city's tropical park, Garcia Sanabria. Just a few kilometres away lies the episcopal and university city of La Laguna, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

If you want to spend a few more days on the island, it's worth taking a trip to the old wine merchant town of La Orotava, the coastal town of Puerto de la Cruz, the oldest dragon tree in the world, or the mountain regions of Anaga and Teno. From the nearby airport, you can fly directly to many international destinations.
